## Order

WHEREAS the New Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board ("Board") has received an application dated December 19, 2007 ("Application") from Enbridge Gas New Brunswick Limited Partnership, as represented by its general partner Enbridge Gas New Brunswick Inc. ("EGNB") for approval of changes to its Small General Service Residential Oil, Small General Service Commercial, General Service, Contract General Service, Off Peak Service, Contract Large Volume Off Peak Service and Natural Gas Vehicle Fueling distribution rates;

## NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. A Pre-Hearing Conference shall be held at the Board's offices, 15 Market Square, Suite 1400, Saint John, New Brunswick, on Tuesday, February 5, 2008, commencing at 10:00 in the forenoon, when and where interested parties may attend and make representations as to the procedure to be followed, the reasoning for an oral hearing and as to any other relevant matters.
- 2.   - a) state whether the person intends to appear at the pre-hearing conference and the official language in which the person wishes to be heard;

b) set out the name of the person and any authorized representative of the person and the mailing address, address for personal service, telephone number and any other telecommunications numbers of the person or the person's authorized representative;

c) establish why the person's interest justifies intervenor status in the proceeding and state the issues that the person intends to address in the proceeding; and

d) EGNB has requested that the Board proceed by way of a written proceeding. Any party who considers that the public interest would be better served by an oral hearing should provide the reasons why with its notice of intervention.
