NOTICE**Adjustments to Maximum Margins, Delivery Costs and Full Service Charge**

The New Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board, having conducted a review of the maximum margins, maximum delivery costs and maximum full service charge for petroleum products, pursuant to Section 14(1) of the Petroleum Products Pricing Act, announces the following adjustments:

1. The maximum retail margin for motor fuels will increase from 5.0 cents per litre to 5.9 cents per litre.
2. The maximum full service charge for dispensing motor fuel will increase from 2.5 cents per litre to 3.0 cents per litre.
